## MINUTES DESERT AIRE OPEN BOARD MEETING TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 07, 2017

### Highlights of the Open Board Meetings

- Treasurer's Report – Unaudited loss for 2016, before depreciation will be approximately \$7,800.

Our Management fees were \$11,075 better than budget, mainly due to a three month reduction in fees. Utilities were about \$20,000 worse than budget due to water penalties, gas costs, and refuse collection.

Our year end reserve fund is \$466,000 which is close to forecast. As our statements are subject to audit, there may be changes to these figures.

- Management Report – Carolyn asked home owners to direct any questions or concerns about the work done by the grounds or cleaning staff to her.
- Gracie's condition has not improved. Anyone wishing to help her may do so via the "Go Fund Me" page or in the office.
- **Committee Reports were given: (Please see bulletin Board for details of each report)**
- Community Relations – Herm Mitzel has arranged to have the street swept after events at the polo grounds. If you see dust call Jim Curtis at 760-559-1581.
- Activities – June Cavendish gave an account of how monies earned last year were spent.
- Real Estate committee is working on an information package for renters and a park standard for park models rented through our rental agent and private rentals.

Mark Monaco, our rental agent reminded home owners that security deposits must be returned to renters within 21 days.

Mark currently has 23 leases on 15 park models and 8 RV lots.

Patty O'Connor has an inventory of 19 homes and 5 RV lots. Patty is leaving and will be taking another position outside the park at the end of the season.

- Landscape and Design presented an ER (expenditure request) for \$1,805 for landscaping around the pump house.

Nancy Clarke thanked Gail Erickson and Grace Hartwig for their work on the Memorial Garden and Sue Adams and Glenda Klein for their work on the planters. Alfonso and his crew were also thanked for doing a great job maintaining the gardens. If anyone is interested in joining this committee, please contact Nancy Clarke.

- Buildings and Grounds – Don Hammond informed home owners that work will soon begin on the roof.

Repairs and painting are being done in the shuffleboard.

Repairs are being done on the west B side pond to improve the water level.

Hope presented an additional ER, in the amount of \$3,870. for the repairs on the roof.

- Ad-Hoc Landscape Planning Committee – Kurt told home owners that the contract to do the "red areas" of the park, which are on Indio water, was awarded to T.K.D. which is a smaller landscape company. The plans will be available soon.
- Marketing and Communications are working towards branding a consistent look for all communications going out of the park. The committee is expanding their marketing in the north and will be targeting those states and provinces.

- Security is re-designing the beams in lot fore, due to the new pickle ball court. The dog park wall will be beamed, and spikes on the east wall behind the dumpsters will be extended two feet as a deterrent. An ER for \$5,599 was presented for security beams and steel. Also, there will be an additional \$40/month in monitoring fees. If you can help Security after April, see Gordy Klein.

The security committee asks that all bicycles and golf carts use the roadways after dark, including those with lights. This will make it safer for those walking.

- Emergency Preparedness - Cheryl Boyer has taken over the medical committee and is conducting CPR and the AED training. \*New\* - Incident reports should be filled out after an event and are located in the office until a suitable container is built in the mail room. These forms will enable the group to review what happened, recommend changes to prevent future events and brainstorm on how they could respond better.
- Conservation Committee – A watering guide has been prepared by the conservation committee and is available to home owners at the office.

A letter from the Board was read emphasizing the current Indio Water Restriction “water on the hardscapes”. Home owners are requested to check their irrigation system and controller. If they are contributing to water on the hardscapes they need to take corrective action. The Board would like to see all lots compliant by November 15/17. Our park will look great, water penalties will be lower and the life of our roads, curbs and walkways will be extended.

- Nominating Committee – Dick Bergen introduced his committee of Jean Leathers, Larry Hall, Bob Adams, and Gerry Page. He remembered Larry and all his contributions to

our park, particularly the job descriptions and policies. Candidates were introduced and spoke about their qualifications and views. The order was Hope Hilliard, Kurt Neuman, Anne King, Peggy Miller, Barry Rutz, Jim Sherb, and Brian Dolsen. In Brian’s absence, Grant Hilliard read a letter from Brian.

- 4 persons spoke at the Homeowners Open Forum.

### **CONSERVATION COMMITTEE**

The main focus of the Conservation committee is to investigate ways to conserve energy and water thus reducing costs.

We have changed the auditorium lights to LED's, which do not produce heat, therefore the HVAC system is not used as much. The lights last 50,000 hours reducing labor costs to replace lights. We have replaced weather stripping on doors and adjusted the doors so that they close properly.

You can help conserve energy by turning off lights and closing doors.

We also ask that you adjust your sprinkler controller to turn off the irrigation to the grass areas on March 31 or later when you leave for the season.

Has your irrigation controller battery been replaced this season?

Thank you for your cooperation.

### **AD HOC COMMITTEE**

Let's recap:

In January the Ad Hoc committee submitted their proposed 5 year landscape plan to the Board. The focus of the plan was on Phase 1 which dealt with the new IWA regulation "NO WATER RUN OFF UNTO HARD SCAPE".

The committee recommended that a design company be hired to draw the construction plans to ensure that we meet IWA's strict guidelines and work with IWA for the rebate. This was recommended to be completed this summer by Alfonso and his crew. The estimated cost to complete Phase 1 was \$60,000 before a rebate from IWA of up to \$20,000.

On January 13th, the Ad Hoc committee presented their proposed plan to homeowners. The board at a special meeting on January 17th voted to approve the expenditure for phase 1 which included hiring a design company. That contract was awarded to TKD ASSOCIATES INC. located in Rancho Mirage. TKD is a smaller design company and very willing to work with us

without requiring a Master Plan first. On February 1st, we received the first conceptual plans submitted by TKD for Phase 1. The committee marked these plans with comments and suggestions and returned them to TKD to be revised.

On Wednesday, February 15th the Ad Hoc Committee along with the Landscape and Design Committee and Alfonso, met with TKD Associates to review their revised drawings for Phase I.

On Friday, February 17, the Ad Hoc committee met with homeowners from "A" and "B" side whose property is adjacent to Phase 1. These homeowners had an opportunity to view the plans and see how the proposed changes would integrate with their property. They gave us very encouraging, positive and helpful feedback which will be taken into consideration. We will have one more meeting with TKD on Wednesday, February 22nd to finalize the plans.

Once the finalized plans are received, we will post them in the mail room for everyone to see. We will let you know by email when they have been posted.

### **ARCHITECT COMMITTEE**

The AC team would like to thank all the owners, both in the park and those who were not able to travel down this year, for keeping their properties neat and tidy. It is a big task to conform to the rules of the park which makes our park the envy of all others in the valley.

We have had an extraordinary number of owners who, for whatever reason, have not kept their properties in compliance. We would like to reiterate that it is the sole responsibility of ALL home owners to maintain their properties. If unable to complete the task themselves, owners must make arrangements to have their lot maintained by a landscape maintenance company.

This is not a one day undertaking aimed at the requirements of the annual November inspections. All individual lots must be maintained throughout the season until April 1. Weeds, grass, and trees grow throughout the season and must be attended to on a regular basis. If unable to meet this obligation, please take the necessary steps to have your lot cared for. All properties not kept in compliance of our Desert Aire Architectural Rules, will be maintained by the park association and the owners will be billed accordingly.

On the last page of this Newsletter, just before the calendar, is a sample of the "November 15 Inspection Letter" for next season. Please take a few minutes to review the letter. During the inspections, the AC team will provide the details of any area of a lot that needs to be corrected.

Again, thank you to all those owners who do a wonderful job of keeping our park looking terrific. With everyone keeping their properties neat, clean, and tidy, we will continue to enjoy our beautiful park.

### **BUILDING & GROUNDS COMMITTEE**

Building and Grounds has had a busy month. The new pickle ball court is in and in use thanks to the leadership of John Rumsey, Dan Spino, and Neal Cronk. Due to the diligence of these three, the new court cost half of what it would have cost if we had engaged a contractor. There was lots of help with the construction and they even let Dave Haines and Dave Jones play in the concrete.

Please remember to thank John Rumsey when you see him. He is also masterminding the roofing project on the Club House. When complete, the Auditorium portion of the building will have new roof and the portion currently roofed with metal roofing will also have the new membrane roofing. The project is further complicated by the rerouting of roof drains that

formerly passed through the attic of the building and then down through the back wall to the ground. These drains were often the culprits and not the roof when leaks appeared. John had to modify the slope of the roof so that the roof would drain off the back wall. He, Byron Gardner, and Will Babcock constructed the necessary Crickets to make it happen. John had originally thought it would take up to a week to do so, but he and his crew completed the job in less than a day! Many thanks also go to Rick Burt for hauling the lumber and supplies for the construction.

Maurice Fitzgerald and his new bride Bea have been updating the Shuffle Board Courts. He has patched and painted the indoor cement floor where it had spalled. He spruced up the restroom with paint and a new light fixture and has continued in the main room. It looks so good that we have offered to buy him more paint!

Thanks to Dan Spino, there is considerably more interest in Bocce Ball. He has constructed a new cabinet for the new balls that Activities purchased. He has also worked with Alfonso regarding the mowing and care of the courts. He has generated noticeable interest and participation by residents. Therefore, Buildings and Grounds will have Alfonso and his crew work on leveling the courts this summer.

After homeowners voiced concerns regarding the inconsistent water level in the section west pond, at the request of the Building and Grounds committee, Howard Healey and Alfonso found the problem with the inflow and repaired it so that the level now remains constant.

With each completed project, we are reminded of the many dollars saved by the many freely given hours of volunteer labor, often unrecognized, by residents of the park. Hats off to all who participate.

Building and Grounds has the following major projects on their agenda to hopefully complete this season: 1) work with Security to build new higher security fencing with spikes for the tops of the walls in Lot 4. 2) The raw ends of the A and B Laundries need cleaning, treating and repairing, painting and topping with metal flashing.
