We, as homeowners, must face the harsh reality that conservation is an absolute must. We must always be mindful of the need to conserve water. For an update to the water situation in S. We will have a list of drought-tolerant plants for you to refer to, when you are purchasing flowers for your gardens, this coming season. The employees at Bob Williams Nursery are very approachable & helpful, if you need some assistance in planning your gardens, with water consumption in mind.

All the flower beds will be mulched, the end of

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September, in preparation for the annuals to be planted. Currently the island flower bed outside the gate and the two pots inside the gate are in full bloom with flowers that can adapt to the extreme hot weather over the summer months. This feature, for security reasons, does not make our park look abandoned.

We are excited about the future improvements to the grounds in our Park. The transition to water tolerant plants and landscape in certain areas of our park will be an exciting and necessary feature as we adhere to the water restrictions.

The Landscape & Design committee members wish Alfonso all the best as he recovers from the vehicle accident.
