As this is the first newsletter article I am writing as the president of the Board of Directors, I thought it would be a good idea to remind everyone of our Mission Statement adopted some time ago. I have referred to it often over the last two years as I consider the many decisions we have had to make.

Mission Statement: Desert Aire is a 55 plus, nine-month, residential community designed to protect and enhance the individual and common investments of its residents, while maintaining a caring, affordable and diverse quality of life.

MINUTES DESERT AIRE OPEN BOARD MEETING - By Linda Healey, Secretary DA Board

Highlights of the Open Board Meeting Held Tuesday, March 07, 2017

- Prior to the Open Board Meeting, an Executive Meeting of the Board was held to deal with a non-compliant home owner.
- Bob informed home owners that there is a due process to follow when rules are violated. The Board is limited in what it can say regarding these matters, due to confidentiality.
- All homeowners should ensure they comply with the Indio Water restrictions - no water on the hard scapes by November 15, 2017.
- Spectrum contract will be effective April 01, 2017. We will hear more from Carolyn.
- The Board is looking at creating rules to deal with short term rentals and advertising for the Coachella Music Festivals.
- John Sullivan reported our finances are in good shape with no delinquencies.
- John Sullivan presented an E.R. (expenditure request) for \$2,650. for 10 garbage cans (the ones in the ground).

- Our Community Relations Committee chair Herm Mitzel has resigned and Anne King will take over. She will act on our behalf as a member of the P.D.A. (Polo District Alliance). This group meets at least one a year to deal with issues surrounding the festivals and concerts.
- Real Estate Our new Realtor/Rental Agent Mark Monaco was introduced and welcomed by Donna Irvine, Chair of the committee.
- Architectural Committee All home owners are asked to keep their lots in compliance to the end of the season. Have a look at the November 15th inspection sheet to ensure you are compliant.
- Landscape and Design want to know if you are attached to anything in the trophy case.
 If so, see Nancy Clarke.
- Buildings and Grounds have completed some major projects – new pickle ball court, security spikes, and shuffleboard repairs. Hope presented an E.R. in the amount of \$3,500. for a park maintenance cart.
- Ad-Hoc Landscape Committee Have met with Alfonso and T.K.D. to review initial plans. Adjacent home owners have been contacted and were invited to see how the plans affect their lots. Feedback was given to the design consultant. The updated plans will be ready soon.
- Marketing & Communication This committee will be targeting snowbirds in the northern states and provinces to promote our park. They have also been working with the Real Estate Committee in completing a package for renters.
- Security Alarms are set to go on at 10:00 p.m. and off at 5:00 a.m. An E.R. in the amount of \$1,193/year for extra lighting in lot fore was presented.

The season is over for us but work is ongoing for Alfonso and crew. We are putting together a summer program for him that is quite intensive with the updating of the 6 red zone areas to meet IWA requirements.

Quite a bit of discussion has been ongoing for Electrical pedestal replacement as one has actually failed. We have spoken to an electrical contractor and also done a walk around the park. The pedestals are set in cement and dirt has built up around some of them rusting them off. Replacement cost could be between \$500 and \$1000. The pedestals are the responsibility of the homeowner. We are recommending homeowners keep them clean and dry around the cement and they should last many more years.

On a positive note, the roof is nearing completion and should be done soon. Many thanks to the many volunteers, especially John Rumsey whose efforts kept the costs down. John did this in his spare time when he wasn't working on (playing on) the pickle ball court.

Working with the security committee the new fencing was also installed around the east end of lot 4. This involved over 10 people volunteering from cutting to welding to installing the metal spikes.
