Highlights of the Open Board Meetings

December 4, 2018

INTRODUCTIONS: The Board was introduced. Everyone was present except Carolyn Quintana.

Hope shared a few comments with the audience. At this meeting we will adopt the service/comfort animal policy provided by HUD. We have to

accommodate these animals. Carolyn will handle the forms necessary for the animal owner to fill out upon their arrival at our park.

Bathroom renovations was one of the top priorities from the survey last year. We are now investigating the costs and what it would take to be in compliance with the new laws on low water usage products. Costs and plans are currently being drawn up. The board would like to have everyone's input so a hot topic will be held in January.

A new rule for short term rental advertising will be discussed later in the meeting.

Secretary's Report: June Cavendish

A motion was made to accept the minutes from the November 6, 2018 open board meeting. The motion was seconded by Judy Bailey. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Anne King

Anne thanked Bob Langin and Steve Such for their help on the finance committee. The open budget meeting was held on Nov. 19th and 14 homeowners were present. The 2019 budget and the reserve fund were presented. Everyone should have received a copy of these by mail or electronically. Copies are available in the office. The Oct. statement has not been received yet from DRM so a report will be given at the January meeting.

RULE CHANGE – A rule change was introduced that will restrict all advertising for short term rentals with a penalty for advertising. Homeowners have 30 days to comment on the rule before it is voted on at the January meeting. Copies of the rule were handed out at the meeting and are available in the office.

Mark Wilson reported that he and Cheryl Boyer will conduct CPR classes in January. Sign up sheets will be on the bulletin board. The new defibulators to be placed in the laundry rooms will be installed soon.

Donna Irvine reminded the homeowners that if they rent their units they are responsible for keeping the items in their units updated and in working order. A list is available in the office of the items that should be in your unit.

- 5. Mark Monaco, the real estate agent gave a report on properties for sale and rent through his office. Currently 17 properties are for sale and 17 properties have been rented. He has received 72 requests for rentals and unfortunately was not able to accommodate all of them.

Brian presented a motion for an ER for \$2,000 for repairs and expansion of the horseshoe pits. Judy Bailey seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Don Hammond reported on work being done by his committee. They will be working on the horseshoe pits and the bocce ball courts. Roof repairs are going on now. The walls behind the rose bushes have been painted.

Judy gave the report for Barb Eggiman. 62 units were not in compliance on the Nov. 15th check. Reminder to homeowners that dirt removal from your property is your responsibility not Alfonso's crew.

 Nancy Clarke reported that outside the front gate will be redesigned and the work will be done by Kirkpatrick Landscape. The work should start soon and geraniums will be planted for now. If you are having trouble with nutgrass or bugs on your plants Bob Williams nursery will be glad to work with you on getting the right spray. A good reference book "Lush & Efficient" for flowers and trees in this area is available at the nursery.

Motion made for \$400 ER for a new cell phone for the security team. Kurt Neumann seconded. Motion passed.

BUILDING & GROUNDS COMMITTEE

Work by the B & G troops continued through the month of December. Instead of listing work that has been accomplished, I want to take this opportunity to provide some important information.

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The park has two separate and very different water systems. When we gained access to the canal water (supplied by the Coachella Valley Water District), the decision was made to use it to supply the ponds and to set up a separate system for watering the large common areas.

The canal water is non-potable thus can not be used for drinking and cooking. Our potable water is supplied by the the Indio Water Authority and is a completely separate system. When we created the canal water irrigation system around the club house, we dug trenches and put in a new separate watering system. The in ground valve systems for distribution of the water is color coded per code with the green lids signifying potable water (Indio) and the pinkish/purple lids signifying canal water.

At various locations, there are manual valves (hose bibs) in the canal water distribution system.

The handles have been removed from them to prevent accidental use as potable water by residents or guests. Park staff are the only users of these valves and are the only ones with access to the handles.

As a point of interest, our canal water comes to us through the All American Canal from the Colorado River near Yuma, AZ a distance of 123 miles. Our particular arm of the canal is the first drop or withdrawal from the main canal. It flows into our ponds with pressure created by gravity only.

Electrical pedestals are installed on concrete footings which must be exposed. Throughout the park, many are under as much as 10 inches of soil which creates rust and deterioration of the pedestal. If you cannot see the concrete footing, you must remove the soil and let the pedestal dry out. Allowing the pedestal to continue to rust could necessitate complete replacement.

One owner has received a bid of \$2900 for replacement.

New covers have been installed at the A and B pools. Water Volley Ball people are responsible

for the covering and uncovering the pools. Per code, when the covers are on the pools, the gates must be locked. If you want to use either pool and the gate is locked, contact water volley ball people for someone to open the gate and help uncover the pool for you. We need to cover the pools late afternoon on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. Those nights the pools will be covered to conserve heat which significantly reduces the cost.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE Mark Wilson. Chair

There are a few things I would like all of us to do when we arrive at our desert home.

- Replace your batteries in both your smoke detector and your CO² detector. After you've installed the new batteries, press the Test button to ensure they are in good working order.
 - (If you need help with any of the above, I would be glad to help you. I'm in the book.)
- 2. Buy some bottled water. Have enough water to supply yourself for up to 72 hours. (one gallon per person per day)
- Make sure you have some non-perishable food in the pantry. Canned meat, canned vegetables, soups, etc. Again you will need enough to last 72 hours.
- 4. Have some cash on hand. In the event of a long power outage our credit &/or debit cards will not do us any good at the store.
- Lastly we should have a supply of our medication on hand.

AED(AUTOMATIC EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR) UPDATE

Two new additional AED's have arrived. One has been placed in each of the A&B laundry rooms in a metal storage cabinet. Please familiarize yourself with where they are located. The third one remains in the mail room..

In case of an incident Call 911, send someone to get the AED closest to the event (where incident happened). Take the AED to event, push green button to turn AED on and follow prompts. You do not need to know CPR to use and AED. Time is of essence and that's why we are fortunate to have two additional AED's to improve response time.

There will be 2 "chest compression" only CPR classes on January 24, repeated on February 21. Watch for the sign up sheet to be posted on the announcement board. These classes have been well received are free and last about 1.5 hours. Don't hesitate to sign up if you need a refresher. However, class size is limited so sign up early.
