LANDSCAPE & DESIGN COMMITTEE

Adhering to the "summer to-do list" that was compiled by **Buildings & Grounds** and **Landscape & Design**", the "in house" crew and Kirkpatrick Landscaping have been working on these tasks. Tony & his crew have been tackling maintenance in the community buildings, painting the interiors, spiffing up the paint on our individual properties, where indicated, weeding & cleaning around the Lagoon areas, removing trees where designated, pruning bushes & hedges where requested, and giving Lot Fore a greatly needed enhancement in some of the garden landscaping.

Kirkpatrick has done an aggressive pruning of the Bougainvillea, along Avenue 49, which was long overdue. This should provide strong growth and extend the life of these bushes.

The "bender boards" on the boulevards, that were improperly placed, have been installed and will make the irrigation more efficient. Kirkpatrick Landscaping will enhance some of the boulevard areas with more stones & rocks, add more DG where needed and add plantings that were requested, to replace ones that had died due to poor irrigation.

The annual flowers have been ordered and will be planted in the flower beds, as indicated, by Kirkpatrick Landscaping in mid-October. The Rose beds will be enhanced with new bender boards to replace the existing, deteriorated edging. All of these beds will be topped up with more soil & mulch in early October.

The two Pepper trees that were dying, across from the "Putting Green" have been cut down and their stumps will be ground by our "in house" crew. Kirkpatrick has been given permission to order 3 large Pepper trees and oversee the planting, on the boulevard, across from the Putting Green. We rely on their expertise.

Irrigation and the monitoring of this, throughout our Park is a must. Far too many plants & trees have been lost because our irrigation was faulty & not monitored. Kirkpatrick Landscaping, who has a certified & professional Irrigation crew member, is gradually replacing our faulty irrigation. The 3 round & raised flower beds, in our patio area will all be refurbished with new irrigation, this summer when the stumps are ground.

Until we reunite in the fall, enjoy the summer months, wherever you are and keep healthy.

REAL ESTATE COMMITTEE

Here we are at the end of another season at Desert Aire! The winter has flown by and it is time for all of us to go to our summer homes.

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The Real Estate Committee has been at work to make the rentals at Desert Aire the best they can be so that our renters not only enjoy the activities, but also the places that they live.

Many of the things that the real estate committee completed and the Board approved over the last 5 years are:

- 1. A Real Estate sign has been placed at the entrance to the park.
- 2. Participated in the hiring of our new realtor Mark Monaco.
- 3. Created and had printed our colored brochure for distribution to new homeowners and renters.
- 4. Designed a Desert Aire renter information packet which includes water restrictions, local information, security bulletin, TV lineup, "When is Clean-Clean Enough", and "Your Opinion Counts" which is feedback from the renters.
- 5. Developed "Standards for Rentals".
- 6. Created an email address for the Real Estate Committee.
- 7. Wrote an explanation for the uses of the administration fee.
- 8. Worked with the Board of Directors to develop a rule change for minimum 30 day rental period.
- E-Blast sent to remind owner landlords that it is their responsibility to insure that their renters can both get into the park and/or the unit when they arrive at Desert Aire. The office is not responsible for letting renters into the park or the units they have rented.
- 10. Posts all For Sale/For Rent by owner listings on the Desert Aire website. The rentals that are listed on the website must meet the minimum requirements that have

been developed. Those requirements can also be found on the Desert Aire website.

11. Created "Attention all Renters" information posted on the bulletin boards in the mail room, laundry facilities, as well as the main bulletin board.

The committee is currently working on a form for all owners to complete with information for their renter/heir that will make moving into a unit much easier. It will include things that are common to all park models as well as things that are unique to each unit such as instructions for the television, where the hot water heater turns on and off, etc.

The Real Estate Committee has completed the expectations mandated from the Board of Directors. There has been some discussion about the future expectations for this committee. There will be some changes to the members and the tasks the committee has in the future. The focus of the committee will be to provide oversight and assure the work that has been completed will be updated as needed so that the renters experience is a pleasant one and they will want to return to our park as renters or owners.
