MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

First of all, the Board would like to welcome back all those people who arrived in November. Nice to see more Canadians in the park this year since the border opened. With more people in the park we need to be extra aware of walkers who are out enjoying the nice weather and visiting with friends who might have been away since early 2020. Also, please carry a flashlight when out walking in the evening.

The Board is busy working on a couple of contracts which will impact our residents. Our laundry contract, which was initially set up in 2008, is being rewritten to reflect the increased cost of water and electricity for washing drying our laundry. We are going to increase the wash cycles from \$1.00 to \$1.50 and a dry cycle from \$.25 to \$.50. These prices are in line with what other parks in our area are charging.

Now for the good news. Our Spectrum cable contract is in negotiations and it looks like we

will not be hit with any significant price increase but will be receiving more channels like the golf and tennis broadcasts. Along with this Spectrum is going to provide all units with a DVR. (Digital Video Recorder) This will allow watchers to record their favorite programs. The small DTAs that Time Warner put in will be phased out. More information will be made available once the contract is finalized.

The ponds that we treated last year are looking good and Dave Haines and his people will be doing more cleaning and treating in the next few months. The floating aeration in the ponds is helping to keep the algae in check as well.

On the ongoing Covid-19 front, we have had two cases so far and are urging our residents to keep up with the protocols as set out by Riverside County. We will closely watch their recommendations and adjust the protocols in In the mean time, enjoy the Desert Aire. sunshine and stay safe.

Highlights of the Open Board Meeting

Tuesday, November 2, 2021 AT 10:00 AM

INTRODUCTIONS -

Introduction of Board Members was made by President Barry Rutz. Members present were Barry Rutz, June Cavendish, Steve Harvey, Barb Eggiman, Ken Bailey, Dave Haines. Cheryl Boyer was out of town. Meeting was held via teleconference.

COMMENTS FROM THE PRESIDENT -

Barry welcomed everyone back. He read a list of 25 new home owners this past year. He reminded everyone that the speed limit in the park is 15 mph. That applies to electric bikes, golf carts and cars. The big summer project this year was resurfacing the decks of all the pools. They look great. As per the memo this fall all outside activities are going to take place. Masks are not mandatory outside. Please feel free to wear one if you choose. The large indoor activities are still not taking place this year. Small inside activities like line dancing, yoga, billiards, quilting, the gym, cards and games can still be held.

SECRETARY'S REPORT - June Cavendish

June made a motion for approval of the minutes of the March 2, 2021 Open Board Meeting.

Motion was seconded by Dave Haines. Motion passed.

TREASURERS REPORT – Barb Eggiman

Barb thanked the Finance Committee for their invaluable time, effort and considerable skills in managing the finances of the park. Financial report: Operating Fund - expenses exceeded the budget by \$18,000. The cost of grass seed has doubled and gas and water rates have increased over last year and the park has not been reimbursed yet for the individual lots that had tree trimming. Payroll expenses are favorable by \$4,000. This savings is due to not needing a part time housekeeper last year. We are hiring a part time person effective Nov. 1, 2021. Barb made a motion that the September financial reports be accepted. Motion was seconded by June. Motion passed.

Reserve Fund – The balance in this fund is \$607,890 which is an increase of \$51,000. Expenses paid out this summer were \$67,000. The largest expenses were finishing the club house roofing (\$14,000), pool decking project (\$35,000), pond cleaning (\$6,000). The other ER's are listed under the report for Building and Grounds.

MANAGEMENT REPORT – Carolyn Quintana

Carolyn reported that two new people have been added to the crew – Carlos and Chris and Dani has been hired to start Nov 1 to help Christina part time

COMMITTEE REPORTS –

Activities – June Cavendish

Teddy Wilson was not present but the committee will be meeting next week to discuss the activities for this year. June thanked Michael #267 for adding some fun to a Halloween gathering on the patio.

Buildings & Grounds – Dave Haines

Don Hammond thanked the people that helped fix the out gate problem. Bill Wilson spoke about the water issues this summer that damaged 3 units. He discussed some various ways to protect your property and will have examples at the club house for the homeowners to look at.

Elaine Babcock spoke on behalf of the committee and reminded everyone to read the rules in the directory for making improvements to their lots. Lot inspections will be Nov. 15th, so get things cleaned up. The committee will be meeting on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays this year. Work orders are located in the mailroom. Turn them into the office so they can be passed on to the committee. January 11th the committee will hold a meeting for all new homeowners to discuss the process of work orders.

Landscape & Design – Cheryl Boyer

Cheryl was not present. June called upon Nancy Clarke for her report. Two homeowners, Barb Sloan and Carole Hiltman have volunteered to take over the memorial garden. Need someone to water the plants until they return in Dec.

Emergency Preparedness – Cheryl Boyer

Barry Rutz reported for Mark Wilson. The committee is currently looking into purchasing a trailer and supplies for disasters.

Security – Barry Rutz

Gordy Klein reported that very few problems occurred this summer. The security system has a few issues right now and new parts should be arriving this week. Hopefully the system will be operating completely by next week.

Nominating Committee – Ken Bailey

The committee will be visiting everyone this month to see who might be interested in running for the 3 positions that are open on the board this year. Election will be held in March.

ARCHITECT COMMITTEE

A big thank you to the lot owners who had your properties ready for the November 15 inspection. It is always with great satisfaction when we see the park looking so nice. There have been questions regarding desert landscape in setback areas. Rule 11,b,iii states that "shrubs, plants, etc. must be included in the proposed area, spaced a maximum of 48 inches apart and with an adequate water supply."

A big change for the committee is that we will be meeting twice a month, the second and fourth Tuesdays. For you, the owners, this involves your need to plan your projects ahead of time for the committee to be able to process your work orders. Any changes made to the outside of your park model and/or lot needs prior approval: landscape changes, structural changes, patio or

deck additions or changes, adding cement, building a new shed. Once approved, a copy of the approved work order will be placed in the owner's mail box. The Desert Aire Directory lists all the architectural rules.

On January 11, 2022, 9:30am, on the patio, the committee will hold an informational meeting for questions and general information on the architectural rules. New owners are encouraged to attend and all are welcome.

BUILDING & GROUNDS COMMITTEE

1) When you leave the park for an extended period of time (more than a few days), be sure to turn off the water to your unit at the pedestal. If you are unsure where and how to turn off the water, contact a member of Building and Grounds for help.

2) We have had a number of units where the water supply to the unit has been turned on by parties unknown for reasons unknown while the owners are absent for prolonged periods of time – sometimes creating expensive repairs. Building and grounds has placed a board with a display of a lockable ball valve and two different devices to lock existing ball valves in the breeze way near the office. All items are available on line. If your unit doesn't have a ball valve type shut off, there are specific lockable devices available for most other valves and are available on line.

3) When you place yard debris in the street for pickup by our guys, place small debris like weeds and leaves on a tarp so that the whole pile can be picked up easily. If you have a pile of bougainvillea or other thorny material, please just place in a neat pile by the curb so the guys can pick it up by using a pitch fork – much quicker and easier. 4) If you want to communicate with the Building and Grounds Committee, you can do so by sending an email to: dabldgandgrds@gmail.com Use this to alert us to something that needs attention such as lights not working or just a general question or suggestion.

5) We have a wonderful 10 mile down and back bike lane on Madison street going south. Bike lane in both direction. The bike lanes are wide and we have always felt safe using them.
